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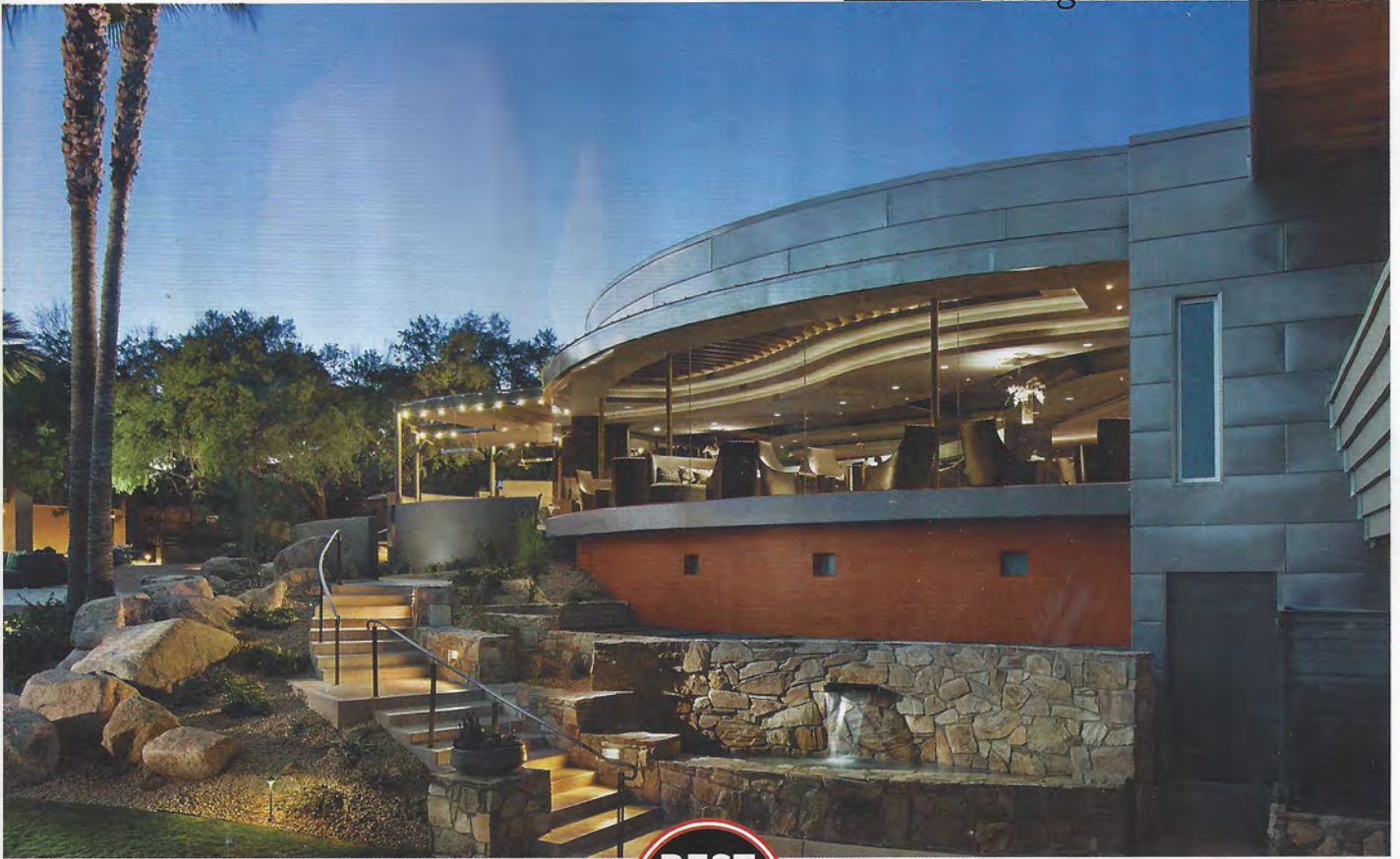

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The challenge: transform a 50-year-old, 1,344-square-foot, dark, dated and introverted resort bar into a sleek, seductive, signature bar lounge attracting new patrons and stimulating food and beverage consumption.

Collaborating with ownership, architects, engineers, contractors, FF&E vendors and a renowned bar advisor, the designer created a bold 2,972-square-foot plan. The backlit onyx drink rail provides an illuminated divide between lounge dining and the bar while aligning interior spaces with the outdoor patio. A lighted cove ceiling inspired by trips to Dubai and Shanghai is joined to the original wood ceiling, maintaining a visual/textural connection with the resort architecture. A Makassar ebony entry portal reveals spectacular mountain views and a sophisticated environment to consume signature cocktails and a new dining menu.

Designer created each furniture piece and selected all finishes to strengthen the branded bar name.
